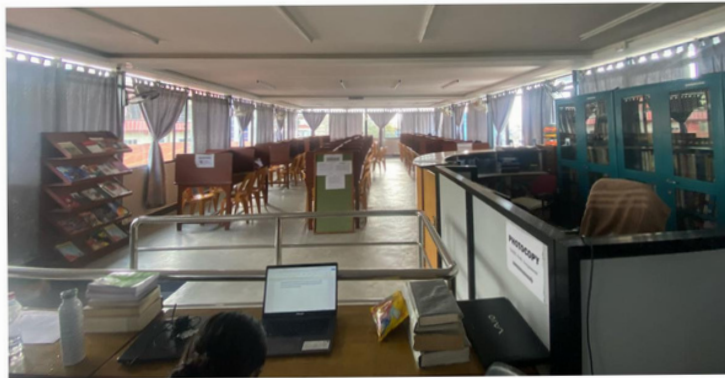

ABOUT THE LIBRARY

In the library of Nepal Ebenezer Theological Seminary, there are more than 10,000 books, including all Nepali books and periodicals. There are 10,021 books overall, with 8,123 different titles. This library has a fair amount of space, so the number of students that can be accommodated is about 50. They can all study together, one at a time.

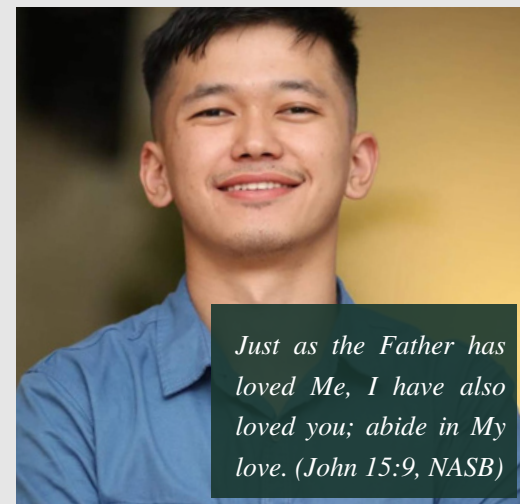
We also have the facility of a computer lab. Students have access to private tables where they can read, keep laptops, books, and take notes. There is a solid electrical system as well as a good fan system. The internet and Wi-Fi are also accessible, but only if required.

However, my pastor made it very obvious to me, and I confessed the Lord Jesus as my Savior on that day. After completing my higher secondary education, I returned home. I then began to consider my future plans and how I would make money. I chose to join the British Army after learning more about it. I went to Pokhara to attend the training facility. Before I entered the training facility, I was slim and skinny. I put in a lot of training, and I was confident that I would join the British Army. I eagerly awaited the result while the selection process was ongoing. However, when I became aware that my name didn't actually exist, I became really sad for almost a month and started spending a lot of time in my room by myself.

My family fervently prayed for me to be freed from that sad circumstance. Later, I realized that I had made various attempts to acquire good things in my life, but God actually wanted me to come and work for his Kingdom.
