UBTC equips servant-leaders through transformation holistic Biblical education for bringing God's kingdom into every area of life and values the unity of the body of Christ by evangelical faith.

Greetings from pleasant winter of Mongolia!

As of today, Union Bible Theological College accommodates a total of 112 students, with 31 enrolled in master's programs, 31 in bachelor's programs, and 41 in certificate programs. These students benefit from the dedicated service of our faculty and staff, comprising 9 full-time teachers, 3 part-time teachers, and 9 support staff. At the Union Bible Theological College, our commitment extends beyond academics. Every Monday, the teachers and staff join in continuous prayer for the well-being of Mongolian churches, school boards, executive leadership, students, graduates, and the people of Mongolia. If you have any specific prayer requests, we warmly welcome you to share them with us.

Last year, a Christian Ministry modular class was conducted between November 6th and December 1st. The semester saw the participation of a total of 21 students, including 10 new students. Among them, 2 students came from Bulgan Sum of Hovd Aimag, another 2 from the central areas of Bayan-Olgii Aimag and Tsengel Sum respectively. Additionally, 3 students came from the Sum of Bulgan Aimag, 2 from Baganuur District, 1 from Gobi-Altai Province, and 1 individual from Chuluut Sum of Arkhangai Aimag. Notably, 13 students from remote rural areas are pursuing their studies in the program.



On December 22, 2023, the faculty, staff, and students of UBTC came together for a unified "Christmas" worship celebration. Participants included day and evening students, those from the Modular Class, the Organizational Leadership Master Class, as well as representatives from the Boards and Alumni Association. The Student Council took charge of organizing this festive occasion, and Principal Luvsangombo.G delivered a heartfelt message, sharing words from Luke 2 and extending warm congratulations to all in attendance.





This time, we are delighted to introduce Ulziijargal.B, a lecturer at UBTC.

How did you come to Christ?

My name is Ulziijargal, with the surname Batdelger. In 1998, I attended the youth group of Ameen church for the first time and had the privilege of getting to know Christ. Within a month in 1991, I received Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior and then baptized.

At the church, what ministry are you involved in, and what other volunteer work do you participate in within the Mongolian church?

Upon accepting Christ and becoming an active church member, my journey of service began as a greeter. From 1999 to 2009, I dedicated my time to various roles, serving as a Sunday school assistant teacher, formal teacher, middle school teacher, youth teacher, choir singer, praise conductor, morning prayer worship leader, and translator. During my studies at Presbyterian University and Theological Seminary in Korea, where I earned my M.Div and Th.M, I contributed to the children's ministry of the Andong Presbyterian Church of South Korea for four years.

In Seoul on October 24, 2013, I was ordained as a pastor. Upon returning to Mongolia later that year, I commenced my tenure as a teacher at UBTC, where I have been serving for over 10 years. Additionally, I have voluntarily served on the Board of the MTEE for five years, as a member of the Board of the Mongolian Pastor's Association for six years, and on the Mongolian Organizing Committee of the Global Leadership Summit for the past four years. I actively participate in community outreach initiatives to share the gospel and have collaborated with Mongolian churches and the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association in organizing the Ulaanbaatar Festival of Joy.

How did you start serving at UBTC?

In the winter of 2013, while I was defending my thesis for Th.M., Academic Dean Tumenbayar reached out to me and expressed a desire for my return to teach at UBTC. My connection with UBTC dates back to when I worked as a translator alongside Pastor Ahn Kwang Pyo, who served as a teacher and board director of UBTC since 2003. Over the course of 17 years, Pastor Ahn Kwang Pyo taught, preached, and participated in student admission interviews with other lecturers, and I translated these interactions from Korean to Mongolian. During our collaboration, he frequently emphasized the significance

of UBTC and, through prayer, imparted to me a vision to be part of the future staff at UBTC.

Upon completing my thesis in early December 2013, I returned to my home country on the 14th and promptly commenced my role at UBTC on the 16th. I am currently in my 11th year at the institution, and since 2018, I have served as the Dean of Students.

How have you changed during your ministry at UBTC, and what is your current ministry concept?

Over the years of my ministry at UBTC, I have witnessed the growth and shape of Christianity in Mongolia, spanning more than 30 years. It has become evident that merely planting churches and training leaders are insufficient, given that less than 10 percent of the population has embraced Christianity. The imperative to fulfill the Great Commission of Jesus Christ is clear— the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. There is a pressing need to cultivate theologically educated leaders characterized by humility, a thirst for righteousness, compassion, purity of heart, and a commitment to spreading peace and love.

For me, this ministry embodies the call of the times and represents a highly valued collaborative effort. In pursuing this mission, it is crucial to approach it with love, prayer, understanding, teamwork, and a wholehearted dedication to the people entrusted to UBTC by God.

What are you currently engaged in?

As of now, I am immersed in my pursuit of study. Since March 2023, I have been undertaking Ph.D. studies in Old Testament studies at Presbyterian University and Theological Seminary in South Korea. By the grace of God, I have successfully completed 2 out of the total 6 courses in my academic journey.

Are you concurrently employed at UBTC while pursuing your Ph.D.?

Yes, alongside my Ph.D. studies, I am actively engaged at UBTC in the capacity of an administrative consultant. My responsibilities include representing UBTC with the principal both domestically and internationally, sharing prayer topics, and serving as an advisor to the alumni association.

How do you envision serving in the future?

In the future, after successfully completing my studies, I aim to contribute to the UBTC vision of preparing Servants for the church and Leaders for the world. My commitment will involve dedicating myself to teaching and engaging in various other services to further the mission and goals of UBTC.

UBTC Alumni Association

We express gratitude to students, alumni, lecturers, staff, and fellow believers from member churches for making this event a success across different generations.

The UBTC Alumni Association annually organizes "Millennial Investor Days," fostering an environment for alumni to actively support and collaborate with their alma mater. This initiative aligns with the school's vision of sending "Servants to the Church and Leaders to the World." The campaign focuses on two main objectives. Firstly, it is a time to celebrate and take pride in the achievements of graduates who are actively serving in various capacities, investing in the millennial generation. Secondly, it serves as a platform for alumni to unite in prayer for the school, extending cooperation to the millennial generation through financial investments.
