Today, there are 31 students in master's level, 31 in bachelor's programs, and 41 students in certificate classes, making a total of 112 students studying at UBTC! These students are supported by 9 full-time teachers, 3 part-time teachers, and 9 staff members. We, the teachers, and staff of the Bible School, come together in prayer every Monday, lifting the Mongolian churches, students, faculty, alumni, board of school and Mongolian people. If you have any specific prayer requests, please feel free to share them with us!

The spring semester classes are currently underway, and on Saturday, March 16, 2024, "Sports Day-2024" at UBTC concluded successfully. This time, allow me to introduce G. Myagmarsuren, a student enrolled in the Bachelor of Theology program, currently in their fourth year of study.



How did you believe in Christ?

I came to believe in Christ through a series of experiences in my life. As a child, I attended Christian church services with my grandmother. However, when I was in the first grade at the 62nd school, I had to drop out because my class teacher demanded money that my family couldn't afford. Living with my mother and five siblings, financial difficulties were a constant challenge. Fortunately, I learned about Bright-Future School, which was supported by Christians, and enrolled there.

As I progressed to the 9th grade, I had the opportunity to move into the boarding house associated with the school. Being part of the boarding school community, attending the Eternal Promise Rainbow Church became a regular part of our routine. It was during this time that my faith began to deepen.

Three years ago, I was married in the Eternal Promise Rainbow Church, and now I live with my wife and son, deeply rooted in my faith in Christ.

What church do you attend and what ministry are you doing?

I attend the Eternal Promise Rainbow Church. My journey in ministry began by serving as an assistant teacher at Sunday School after attending the church. Over time, I transitioned to serving in the worship team, where I dedicated myself for a period. Presently, I am in my fourth year serving as a leader in teenage meetings, nurturing and guiding the youth in their spiritual growth.

When and why did you join UBTC?

A turning point in my journey occurred when a leader named Amara visited our church. Around that time, I was presented with an opportunity to study at a Bible School. Initially, I had envisioned pursuing studies at a university or college, but financial constraints stood in my way. It was during a visit from a Korean short-term mission team to our church that things took a providential turn. As I served alongside the team, one of its members expressed a willingness to cover my tuition fees if I chose to pursue further education. Through what I can only describe as God's providence, I was able to enroll and study at UBTC.

How do you feel about studying at UBTC?

Since my initial enrollment in school, my life has undergone significant transformation. Upon entering, I had little knowledge, but now I find myself continuously learning and growing.

The courses on working with children and teenagers have particularly resonated with me. Engaging in practical service has equipped me with valuable skills in interacting with teenagers and effectively communicating with my younger siblings.

Furthermore, I have been inspired to extend my faith and service to the community in which I reside. Consequently, I am contemplating initiating a project aimed at positively transforming my living environment.

What to do in the future?

After graduation, my intention is to apply the knowledge and skills I have acquired to the best of my ability. Currently, I am serving as an evangelist for the congregation, and if the opportunity arises for me to become a pastor, I am ready to embrace it wholeheartedly. My commitment is to serve my church with utmost dedication, aligning my actions with God's vision for me.

Additionally, I have recently been blessed with a new baby, a precious gift from God. Balancing the responsibilities of parenthood alongside my academic pursuits, I am working diligently towards graduating this year.
